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Saturday – Day 1 The Frailty of Man

Introduction:

Isaiah was instructed to contrast the fleeting nature of humanity with the enduring nature of God. Human life is likened to grass and flowers that spring up briefly, only to wither and fade under harsh conditions (**Ps. 37:2; 102:11; 103:15–16**). In contrast, **God remains unchanging**, and **His Word endures forever**. This truth brought hope to the Israelites in exile, reassuring them that God's promise of restoration would surely be fulfilled.

Key Verses:

[Isaiah 40:8]

*The grass withereth, the flower fadeth:
But the word of our God shall stand for ever.*

[Malachi 3:6]

*For I am the LORD, I change not;
Therefore ye sons of Jacob are not consumed.*

[Numbers 23:19]

*God is not a man, that he should lie; Neither the son of man, that he should repent: Hath he said, and shall he not do it?
Or hath he spoken, and shall he not make it good?*

[Hebrews 13:8]

Discussion Questions:

1. What does the frailty of man teach us about how we should live our lives?

Reflect on how understanding the temporary nature of life can affect your priorities, relationships, and time management.

2. Why is it important to trust in the unchanging nature of God?

Discuss how God's eternal nature provides hope and stability in a constantly changing world.

3. How should we respond to the truth that God's promises never fail?

Discuss practical ways to build faith and confidence in God's promises despite trials or uncertainties.

4. How does God's enduring Word provide comfort and guidance in difficult times?

Share personal experiences of how scripture has offered reassurance and strength during challenges.

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Sunday – Day 2

The Unchanging God

Introduction:

In a world filled with uncertainty and constant change, the **unchanging nature of God offers stability and hope**. Unlike humans who are subject to fluctuations in emotions, character, and circumstances, God remains the same throughout eternity. His love, righteousness, and promises never waver. This truth brings peace to believers, knowing that God can always be trusted to fulfill His Word and be a source of unshakable strength.

Key Verses:

[Malachi 3:6]

For I am the LORD, I change not;

Therefore ye sons of Jacob are not consumed.

[Hebrews 13:8]

Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and for ever

[James 1:17]

Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.

[Psalm 102:25–27]

Of old hast thou laid the foundation of the earth: And the heavens are the work of thy hands. ²⁶ They shall perish, but thou shalt endure: Yea, all of them shall wax old like a garment; As a vesture shalt thou change them, and they shall be changed: ²⁷ But thou art the same, And thy years shall have no end.

Discussion Questions:

1. How does society's constant change conflict with God's Unchanging nature?

Discuss the differences between a Christian with a firm foundation and the world that has nothing to stand on.

2. Why is God's unchanging nature significant to our faith?

Explore how this attribute of God strengthens your confidence in His promises and character.

3. How does the unchanging nature of God affect your view of the Bible and His commandments?

Discuss how knowing God's Word does not change influences your daily life and decision-making.

4. In what ways can we reflect the consistency of God in our relationships and actions?

Share practical examples of how believers can strive for steadfastness in faith, love, and service.

5. What areas of your life have you seen God's unchanging faithfulness demonstrated?

Encourage participants to testify about times when God's consistency brought comfort or breakthrough.
